Note: "...The images of gold, of silver, or brass, that might serve to represent the nations and their kings, were successively broken by the iron monarchy of Rome" (*Gibbons Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire*). The ten toes on the image in Daniel 2 and the ten horns on the beast with iron teeth in Daniel 7 represent the ten barbarian tribes of Pagan Rome, seven of which developed into the seven nations of Europe—Germany, Switzerland, France, Italy, England, Portugal, and Spain. The little horn that came up among the ten horns on the beast, and uprooted three of them, represents Papal Rome, which is also known as the Roman Catholic Church.
